# THE GOSPILL INCOLORS

The disciples learned from the Lord Jesus how to use His creation to teach the incredible truth about God's love and plan for life.

The Gospel in colors was first used by an English preacher, Charles Haddon Spurgeon, in a Gospel message on January 11, 1866. Spurgeon was preaching to orphans who could not read. He used three pieces of colored paper, black, red, and white to teach the glorious Gospel of Christ. The black paper represented man's sin, red represented Christ's shed blood and death, and white represented God's forgiveness and our new life.

This method of presenting the Gospel caught on quickly. Hudson Taylor took it to the mission field.

D.L. Moody added a fourth color, yellow, to represent God's love and plan for man. He used it all across America in his meetings. Then, a fifth color, green, was added to represent growing and going.

Untold millions have been won to Christ over the years by using these colors to teach the Gospel.
